The Utah Cultural Celebration Center is pleased to announce our educational program schedule for the 2015-16 school year. Make reservations for your students to join us for **ARTrageous Tuesdays!** We offer diverse arts and cultural activities for student groups of all ages throughout the year.

Typically, **ARTrageous Tuesdays!** programs are about 90 min - 2 hours long, and include a guided exhibit tour or live performance followed by a hands on, participatory, arts making or cultural experience. The program changes each month to take advantage of the diversity of events going on at the center throughout the year. Programs are offered FREE of charge to all public, private, and after school groups. A \$20 reservation fee is charged to hold your space. Groups of about 30 students at a time are preferred. Splitting into smaller groups and alternating between the exhibit tour and hands-on activity will allow us to accommodate larger groups of 60 or more. School groups are expected to bring a number of teachers or other adults to chaperone students appropriately. **ARTrageous Tuesday** programs are offered from 9am through 5pm. **Reservations are required**, and will be accepted on a first come first served basis.

September 29th Calligraphy 3:00-4:45pm, After school program only

Visit with Utah Calligraphic Artists and tour their exhibit, "Letters: Great Authors, Great Quotes." The program will include a short tour of the exhibit, an educational and fun scavenger hunt, and a hands on activity.

Oct 26 & Nov 3 Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead) reservations available throughout the day

Day of the Dead is a traditional holiday in Mexico that honors loved ones who have passed away and celebrates the continuity of life. Students will view a community altar display of colorful folk art objects created for this occasion and will discuss the meaning of each piece. Activities include painting sugar skulls, and paper flower making. An educational video presentation on Dia de los Muertos is also available if your group's time allows. This program is offered from 9am- 5pm on both days. The UCCC also invites all students and their families to attend the free public celebration of Dia de los Muertos on Saturday, from 6-9pm, Nov 2nd.

November 10 ARTrageous Bully Prevention! 3:00-4:45pm, After school program only

Join with Nels Anderson of Drum Bus Utah as we explore the problem of bullying in our schools; why it hurts everyone, and what you can do to help. This afterschool program also includes an interactive and rhythmic experience with "*no more bullies on the bus!*", and the Drum Bus. This program is also available to be hosted in your school with a separate fee.

November 17 ARTrageous Capoeira 3:15-4:45pm, After school program only

Join a lively after school workshop on the Brazilian art form of Capoeira. Capoeira combines elements of martial arts, sports (acrobatics), and music, and was created by descendants of slaves beginning in the 16th century. Local Mestrando Jamaika will share a short video history of Capoeira, followed by demonstrations and lessons. Participants should be sure to wear comfortable clothing and sneakers for the activity.

Dec 1 & 8 Trees of Diversity & Holiday Ornament Making, reservations available throughout the day or by appointment. Explore our annual exhibit of culturally themed holiday trees designed by local arts and ethnic groups. The guided tour is a rich and educational way to talk about the many different ways that people celebrate during the holiday season and the New Year. Following the tours, students will participate in a hands-on art activity and make a holiday ornament of their own.
